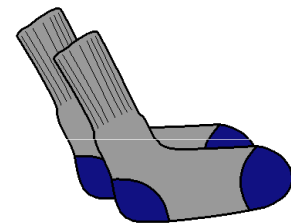
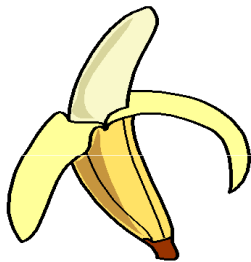




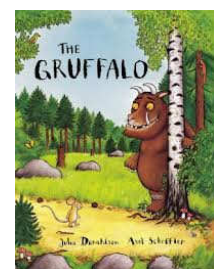
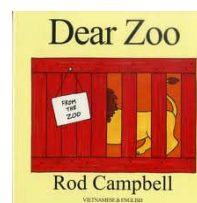
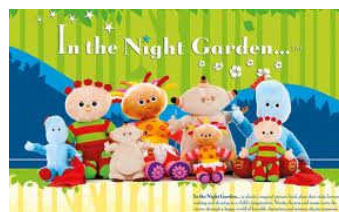
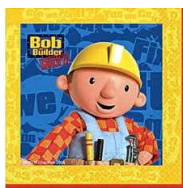
Helping Your Child Understand And Use One Word

When you talk to your child, remember to keep your sentences very short and simple
e.g. 'gone', 'ball'.

1. To help your child to learn the names of things around the house, tell him the names of the objects when you are using them, or names of toys when you are playing with him.



2. Give your child a chance to say these words by giving him a choice of toys to play with, (e.g. 'Do you want ball or car?') or DVD to watch (e.g. 'Do you want In the night Garden or Bob the builder?'), or books to read (e.g. 'Do you want Dear Zoo or Gruffalo?').

3. When you are out and about, or watching TV, or looking at books, point out things to your child and name them or comment on what is happening. Encourage your child to join in and say what he can see.



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
